## Book Notes

248.4 Wel – *Walk Humbly: Encouragements for Living, Working, and Being*, by Samuel Wells (Eerdmans 2019). Wells, vicar of St. Martin-in-the-Fields, London, offers eight meditative chapters in which “reading, contemplating, celebrating, discovering, and praying meet,” leading to “essential existence.”

248.4 Mar – *Falling Free: Rescued from the Life I Always Wanted* by Shannan Martin (Nelson 2016), whose husband Cory is chaplain in the Elkhart County Jail. Her personal experience challenges people from “comfortable middle-class Christianity” to discover “a deeper, richer, and ultimately more fulfilling life.”

Fic Kar – *To Be where You Are*, a Mitford novel by Jan Karon (Putnam’s 2017), is one of 14 novels in the “Mitford” series that depict Episcopal priest Father Tim Kavanagh and his interactions with parishioners in the small town of Mitford.

Fic Kar – *Bathed in Prayer* by Jan Karon (Putnam’s 2018) is a collection of Father Tim Kavanagh’s prayers, sermons, and reflections taken from the author’s best selling “Mitford Series” of novels.

277.3083 Gon – *The God Who Sees: Immigrants, the Bible, and the Journey to Belong* by Karen Gonzalez (Herald 2019), an immigrant advocate who tells her Guatemalan family’s story to help readers “find resources for welcoming immigrants and speaking out about an outdated immigration system.”

259.4 Kee – *The Lifesaving Church: Faith Communities and Suicide Prevention* by Rachael A. Keife (Chalice 2018), a suicide survivor, is a spiritual and practical guide for congregations working with people struggling with suicide, addictions, and alienation.

332.6 – *The Clean Money Revolution: Reinventing Power, Purpose, and Capitalism* by Joel Solomon (New Society 2017) is about how the generational wealth transfer of \$100 trillion in “inherited capital” by 2050 can be used toward “wholesale system change.” Interviews with nine movers and shakers and their ideas about how that might happen.
